SWESA Presents [Jana Reiger, PhD](#) on “Deception 101: When Clinical Research Goes Astray”

This presentation will give the audience a glimpse into the world of clinical research, academic integrity, industry-sponsored trials, and the precarious ethical dance among them. Examples of research misconduct will be used from real cases, as well as from the novel, "A Course in Deception" -- a recently published fictional account of these issues. Potential factors that may lead to research misconduct, as well as potential solutions that have been put forth by experts in the field, will be explored.

Jana Rieger, PhD is an academic by day and a novelist by night. She has been a health researcher since 1999 and recently published a novel called, "A Course in Deception", which tells a story of research misconduct in a clinical drug trial.
